2021-2022 SIP Plan:

Highlights to our SIP:

- 1) Our second quarter staff social was well attended as everyone recognizes the importance of supporting each other's social/emotional well-being.
- 2) Math and ELA lead data continue to be updated in the SIP plan and may be located using the link below. A highlight to point out would be 7th grade writing. 73% of 7th grade students improved one place on the ThinkCerca rubric from their fall to winter writing benchmark!
- Winter Measure of Academic Progress (MAP) testing is underway and will be complete by Friday, January 21. These scores will be used as another data point to accurately assess at what level each of our students are performing at in reading, language usage and math. Teachers in their Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) will compare MAP data against other measures such as ThinkCerca, BT and teacher developed assessments.
