# SIP Goals & Progress:

# Goal #1: IAR scores will increase by 15% in ELA and Math compared to 2019 scores. Another 8% in 2021 and 7% in 2022

- 1) All four social studies assessments have been created focusing extended response questions related to ELA standards in need of support
- 2) Science assessments to date have been redone to reflect a higher math focus than in the past.
- 3) All essential academic vocabulary words are posted in classroom

# Goal 1: Teachers will observe a colleague no less than once per quarter using Rigor Rubric with a follow up discussion regarding rigor/instructional strategies used.

- 1) 13/14 core teachers completed 1<sup>st</sup> qtr. rigor visits to their peer's classrooms. 4/14 have completed their visits for 2<sup>nd</sup> qtr.
- 2) 12/24 staff attended the 1<sup>st</sup> qtr. staff social, 10/24 attended the 2<sup>nd</sup> qtr. staff social.
- 3) Staff continue to implement 7 Habits curriculum in homerooms and Lighthouse Teams are now solidified with team work to begin in January.

# Goal 1: 85% of students will exhibit a positive feeling towards school

- 1) 7<sup>th</sup> grade: My school is a caring place, 40% yes and 52% sometimes 8<sup>th</sup> grade: My school is a caring place, 49% yes, 46% sometimes
  - 7th grade: One adult at school cares about me, 83% yes
  - 8th grade: One adult at school cares about me, 90% yes
