




The amount of work assigned to my child was appropriate during E-Learning 123 responses

- OES ended E-learning with 27 students or 3% of the OES student population receiving an incomplete for the school year.
 - o 4-kindergarten
 - o 1-first grade
 - o 3-second grade
 - o 2-third grade
 - o 3-fourth grade
 - o 2-fifth grade
 - o 12-sixth grade
- OES has seven students who will be retained for the 2020-2021 school year.
 - o 6-kindergarten
 - 2 prior to e-learning
 - 2 parental preference
 - 2 after e-learning due to incompletes/parental consent
 - 1-first grade (parental preference)
 - Two students (one third & one sixth) could be retained if work is not completed over the summer. Retention
 was discussed prior to E-learning.


Mission: Educate students to be lifelong learners who are productive, responsible citizens.



Points of Interest:

- English Language EOY information Mr. Majewski worked with one sixth-grade student, two fifth-grade students, four fourth-grade students, four third-grade students, two second-grade students, two first-grade students, three kindergarteners, and three pre-school students. He utilizes a team teaching as his primary instructional modality. He also works with a large number of mainstream and special education students. Mr. Majewski also provides translations of school communication for the families who have Spanish as their primary language.
 - Out of the 21 students, six of the students will not need EL services next year due to testing out and meeting requirements on the EL assessments given.
- Reading Data Data is not from EOY rather the end of third quarter due to E-learning occurring and reading assessments not being able to occur.
 - There were 67 students from first and second grades who began the year with RTT.
 - By March 20, there were only 27 students receiving RTT services from first and second grades resulting in a 60% reduction of students needing RTT services.
 - o 71% of the first graders met/exceeded their reading growth goal for the third quarter.
 - 90% of the second graders met/exceeded their reading growth goal for the third quarter.
 - 100% (9/9) of the third grade students who received Title services for reading met their third quarter reading goal.
 - **89%** (16/18) of the **fourth grade** students who received Title services for reading met their third quarter reading goal.
 - 71% (5/7) of the fifth grade students who received Title services for reading met their third quarter reading goal.






- 15 students accounted for 56% of referrals this year
