Student Athletic Code Violations Updates

- Two potential incidents reported. No sufficient evidence to issue sanctions in either case.

Faculty and Student Recognition/Other Issues

- Chris Heimerman from Sauk Valley interviewed and ran a story in Sauk Valley Ellen Recamp, Chance Merrill and Valeria Viteri-Pflucker about their presentations in Chicago and Columbus.
- New tables for OHS 124 lab were installed over T-giving break. Old computer tables will have wood recycled by manufacturing tech classes, who built them 20 years ago.

2016-2017 SIP Update

Goal I: Oregon High School staff and students will develop a stronger sense of community during the course of the 2016-2017 school year.

Survey results (included in last BOE report) showed slight dip across all questions. After speaking with Adam Larsen to determine if this was statistically significant, it is not. The results could be interpreted as a positive given first survey was given early in the year, and the second after the novelty of the new years has worn off. Next survey will come in January.

Goal I I: 50% of Oregon High School Students will improve their Hawk Profile (based on Academics, Service, Leadership, and Activities) Index before the end of the school year.

HPI was presented to teachers at 12-8-16 faculty meeting (well received). Mr. Larsen showed teachers how they can recognize a student for leadership in the classroom or activity in Power School. Below is break down of the roll out plan in January.

- **There will be a kid “draft” via Google Sheets starting January 10th to pair a kid with a teacher.**
- **Kids will receive a color copy of their profile the week of January 17th from teacher who “drafted them”.**
- **436 kids/25 faculty=17-20 kids per teacher.**
- **Teacher kid meetings start week of Jan 17th.**
