MARCH 2024 BOARD REPORT

Oregon Elementary School

- Mrs. Stewart continues to meet with students for individual counseling and group counseling. This month groups continued to focus on social skills and emotional regulation. For the month of March, lessons in Jr. Kindergarten-2nd grade focused on careers. Students were able to use an interactive website during one of the lessons to take a career interest survey and then explore jobs that they were interested in. Mrs. Stewart also assisted in the Meridian school district after the loss of a student. She continues to attend monthly meetings and trainings. Mrs. Stewart has also been working with teachers and staff to provide assistance for student behaviors.
- The Student Ambassadors have been creating signs for the new Hawks Closet that will be collecting items for in April. This will be a hygiene closet that will have items available for students who are in need of supplies. The hygiene supply drive is an all-school service project for this semester. Student Ambassadors will help organize and manage the closet once donations start to arrive.



• Mr. Montanola met on a regular basis with 70 students including individual counseling, social groups, and peer conflict resolution groups. He met several times with 18 students for individual counseling. He ran 20 *social groups/ philosophy for children* focusing on personal and collective interests and family. In addition to this, he ran 10 social groups based on the author's craft and character analysis. In addition, he taught four SEL through poetry read aloud. He also provided 152 individualized student work classroom interventions. He contacted seven parents via phone call, and he met with one. Additionally Mr. Montanola attended all mandated meetings.

Oregon Junior/Senior High School

Academic Updates:

- Progress towards the 2024-2025 master schedule has begun through counseling department meetings.
- An informational meeting for incoming 6th Grade students and their families was held on Wednesday, March 20th. Information about junior high courses, academic programming, and involvement was provided along with building tours. 6th graders will also visit OJSHS at the end of the school year with their homeroom periods.

Social-Emotional Wellness Updates:

- Counselors met with students who needed social-emotional support.
- Ms. Peterson continues to meet with students on a daily/weekly/bi-weekly basis to do check-ins and provide needed support.
- Ms. Peterson provided crisis interventions for students in need.
- Ms. Peterson communicated with parents and students to provide referrals for additional support outside of school.

College and Career Readiness Updates:
