

#### **Special Education:**

Co-teaching:

- Subs were scheduled for January 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> for co-teaching teams to meet and plan.
- Much positive feedback from the teams.
- Extra sub times were utilized by teachers to work on RCD units.

#### Response to Intervention (RtI):

- Staff from DLR and OHS attended a webinar at OCEC regarding the implantation of PowerRtI in their buildings.
- OES has been using the program for two years.
- Data and plans are stored for students who are in an intervention either academic or behavior

#### **BSAT (Behavior Student Assistance Team)**

- Collaborating with PBIS on Tier 2 supports for behavior interventions.
- Mr. Montanola to hold a family education group for families of PreK and K; he is also offering ADHD support/education group this year for families using the medical watch list
- Collaborating with All Pro Dads and iMoms regarding topics to be discussed.

#### **Points of Interest:**

Jump Rope for Heart was held January 28<sup>th</sup>-29<sup>th</sup> at OES. PE classes combined and met at OHS to jump. This year's goal was \$10,000; all together OES has raised over \$13,000. A big thank you goes to all the students who have helped the American Heart Association.

Congratulations to sixth grader Abigail Virgil on winning this year's OES Geography Bee.

Two schoolwide PBIS assemblies were held on January 8<sup>th</sup> to reinforce expectations of positive behavior throughout the school. Students from the Student Leaders Club designed and led the assembly which took a gameshow format to engage students.

The BSAT committee met January 21<sup>st</sup> to discuss and review the current process and ideas for building the system. One major focal point was parental notification and involvement in the process. Conversations around this topic will continue at next month's meeting.

Members of the PBIS committee met January 28 and talked about solidifying a Tier 2 system. Main points discussed were:

- What qualifies a student as Tier 2?
- What interventions are available; how do we track the data?
- How does Tier 2 correlate with BSAT?

As the group continues to meet, it will work to flesh out answers to these questions.

### **Grade level updates:**

#### Kindergarten

- Registration for FY17 has begun deadline is March 4<sup>th</sup> to avoid a late fee.
- Kindergarten Kick-off is scheduled for the evening of March 22<sup>nd</sup>.

#### First Grade


