Drug Testing

Through December 7, 140 OHS students have been randomly tested. All tests have been negative.

Extra-Curricular Code of Conduct

Through December 11, there has been only one extra-curricular code violation at OHS. Last year at this time, there had been seven.

Communication

Community Service

Boys Soccer - The boys soccer program ran a car wash for the Village of Progress, assisted in running the soccer tournaments at Park West, worked a food stand at AOP, and helped provide workers for the regional tournament.

Volleyball – In addition to the annual Volley for the Cure Night, OHS volleyball players helped lead the youth summer camp. They led warm up games and drills to help youth campers PreK-8th grade learn the game of volleyball. Some players even ran and planned activities for their own courts. Team members also donated money raised from last year's Volley for the Cure night to Relay for Life in June of Ogle County (\$300). They walked and participated in the evening events and set up the luminary for the evening. This involved separating the bags out on the track and adding the weight and lights to them. Finally, several players volunteered time at the Special Olympics in July. They helped at certain softball stations and led the different teams around the stations. OHS players took down the information from the competitions, cheered on the athletes, and presented the awards at the end of events.

Honors:

Events recently hosted

- Oregon High School recently hosted both the boys and girls varsity and fresh/soph basketball tournaments. The 12 team girls Tipoff Classic was November 15-18 while the boys Thanksgiving Tournament on Nov. 20-25 had nine varsity teams and 12 sophomore teams.
- Hawk Classic Boys & Girls Bowling Invitational @ Plum Hollow was held on December 2.
- 21st Annual Oregon Freshman Boys Basketball Tournament took place on Friday & Saturday, December 15/16 with sixteen teams.

Winter Sports Update

Boys Basketball – As of December 12, the varsity team has a 3-5 record. The Hawks took 3rd place at the nine team Oregon Thanksgiving Tournament. Sophomore Trey Woolsey was named to the All-Tournament Team. The Oregon fresh-soph team is currently 3-8.

Girls Basketball – As of December 12, the varsity girls' team also has a record of 3-5. Sophomore Olivia Lambriksen and senior Bailey Montavon were named to the All-Tournament Team at the Oregon Tipoff Classic. The sophomore squad is currently 2-6 while the freshman are 3-6. Five of the eleven BNC schools are not able to field a freshman level girls team due to low numbers.

Wrestling – As of December 12, the varsity wrestlers had a 3-5 dual meet record with an 0-2 record in conference matchups. The team participated in the Stillman Valley Invitational on Dec. 16 and will participate in Abe's Rumble in Springfield over Christmas break.

Girls Bowling – The girls' team is off to a perfect 6-0 start and have won 47 straight dual matches dating back to 2014. They took second place at their own nine team Hawk Classic and at the LaSalle-Peru Cavalier Classic.

Boys Bowling – The boys are also off to a perfect start with a dual meet record of 7-0. They finished in 3rd place at the L-P Cavalier Classic on December 9.

JH Boys Basketball – Both the 7th and 8th grade teams finished their seasons at Rt. 72 Conference Tournament in Byron. The 7th grade team went 1-6 in regular season conference games while the 8th graders went 4-3.

JH Academic Bowl – The 8th graders finished in 3rd place and the 7th graders finished in 5th place at the Rt. 72 Conference Tournament in Stillman Valley on Dec. 9.
