School Improvement Plan FY 17:

SIP Goal 1 – ELA-Literacy & Math:

- Student Growth: 50% of all students will achieve or surpass their positive individual student-growth target based on local assessment data.

- OES Students will feel more invested and engaged in the school community.

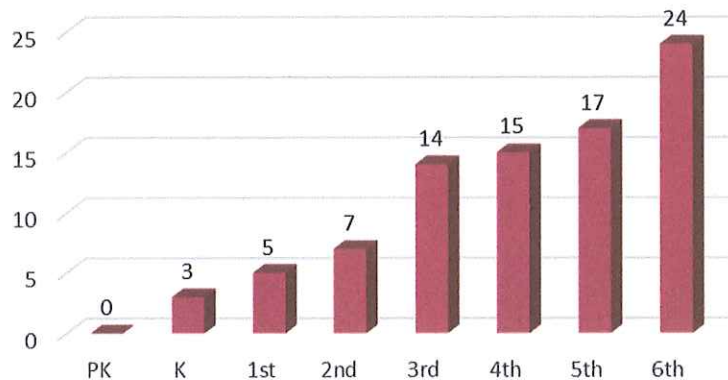

Number of students receiving SEL services on a "regular" basis



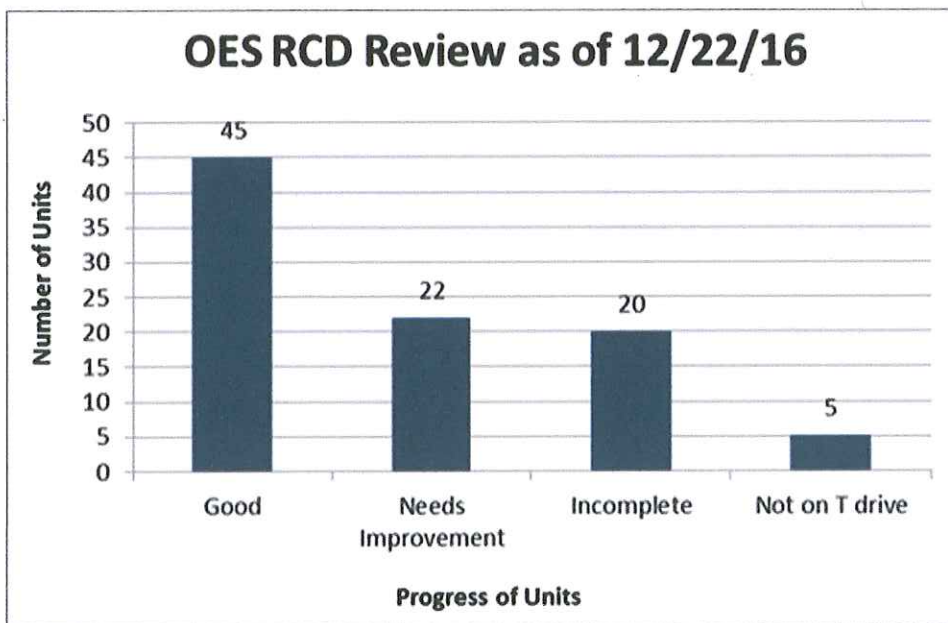

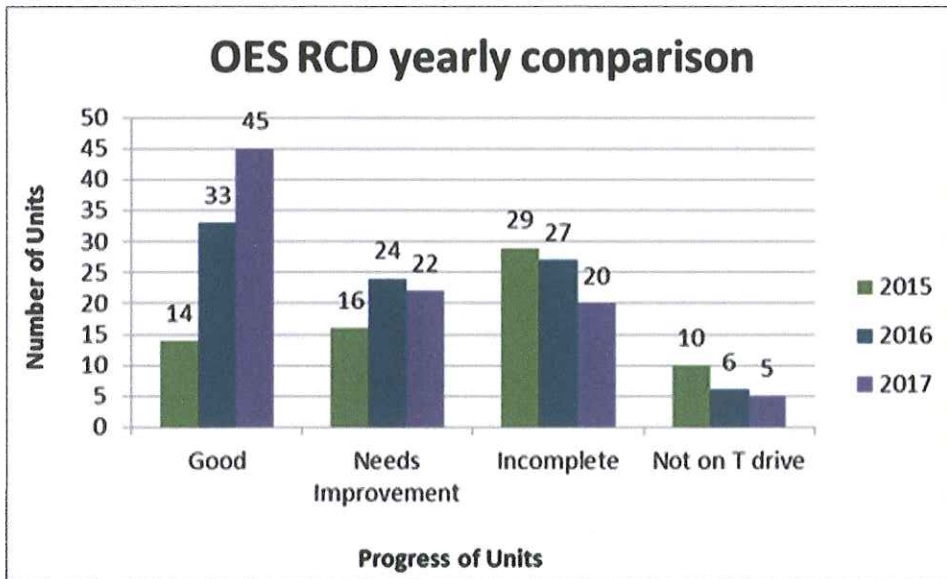
December's Professional Development focus via the weekly Friday Focus and monthly staff meeting:

Response to Intervention (Rtl):

Title 1

- Care packages were sent home with students who receive services in first and second grades. Students who returned a calendar and read for at least seven days over break received a reward.
- 41 students received the care packages... 18% of the students regressed in reading skills. 71% of the students who fell did not read over break, per conversation with student.
- 82% of the students maintained the reading skills over break
- 50% of the reading logs were returned

Points of Interest:

A book exchange was held for students on December 13th and 14th. This year, approximately **2,850** books were put into the hands of students from PreK – 6th grade through the exchange. The exchange was organized by Mrs. Mandi Callaway and Ms. Volkening; a number of staff members assisted in the event in a variety of ways. We also had student-helpers in third-sixth grades who helped the classrooms during the distribution.

On December 14th, Mr. Beske continued an annual tradition by hosting caroling in the Jefferson-wing gym. A number of classes came to listen to the festive music from the band.

On December 8th, the fifth and sixth grade bands & choirs performed their annual holiday concert. It truly is amazing to see the growth from students between their beginning in the program to midway through sixth grade. This has moved to the OHS gym due to the size of audience drawn to the event.

On December 7th, OES held its staff Christmas gathering at the Oregon Train Depot. Staff who participated were able to participate in a cookie exchange, eat dinner, and relax.

The 6th grade student leaders planned and held a pet supplies drive to raise items to Noah's Ark animal shelter in Rockford. Students throughout the school brought in different pet-related goods over a two-week period. Ms. Volkening's third-grade class won the contest and they along with the student-leaders will deliver the items and have a pizza party hosted by the Rockford Area Conventions and Visitors Bureau. The Trip was originally scheduled for December 19th, but postponed due to the severe cold weather.

A family night was held at OES on December 15th.

- Holiday Storybook Night with 1st and 3rd grade musical concerts was hosted by OES where families were able to make various crafts, listen to stories, make cards, enjoy a concert and have dinner together.
- Activities occurred throughout OES from 5:00 – 7:00.
- Over 300 enjoyed the activities and dinner with baked potatoes provided by Marty Boyd. Thank you to the kitchen staff for cleaning and cooking the baked potatoes.
- The event was coordinated by Mrs. Albrecht, Mrs. Glendenning, Mr. DeWilde, Ms. Donnelly, Mrs. Davis & Mr. Majewski
- Several staff volunteered for the activities, to serve our families dinner, give monetary donations and provide resources and/or materials for the evening.

A second informational roundtable was held on December 13th at DLR to share thoughts and ideas on The Leader in Me. Those who have attended TLIM events previously shared the positives that they saw with the process, and the meeting provided a forum for those attending to also ask questions and share concerns. This meeting was open to all staff. The group discussed how information learned about the process can be put to action within our district.

Grade level updates:

PreK - Holiday concert for students in the Foundations class as well as students in Mrs. Kenney's EC room who will be attending kindergarten next year occurred on December 14th in the J. Wing gym. Students sang songs and had milk & cookies with their families.

K – Kindergarten students were able to enjoy various types of gingerbread man books. With this activity, the students compared the various books, characters and endings.

1st – Students were able to travel to all of the first grade classrooms and participate in a different holiday activity in each room.

2nd – Students participated in various activities for the second grade Winter Celebration. Each activity was thirty minutes so students were able to experience each teacher's activity.

3rd - Melinda from, Ag in the Classroom came, and she gave a lesson on different types of Christmas trees. The students also created their own Christmas trees with shapes. They also had students from high school 4-H clubs around the area come in and do a science activity with the students. They also talked about different activities and events that can be done while in 4-H. On December 15th and 16th, the students had a grade level Christmas around the World. They were able to travel from room to room learning about each teacher's country.

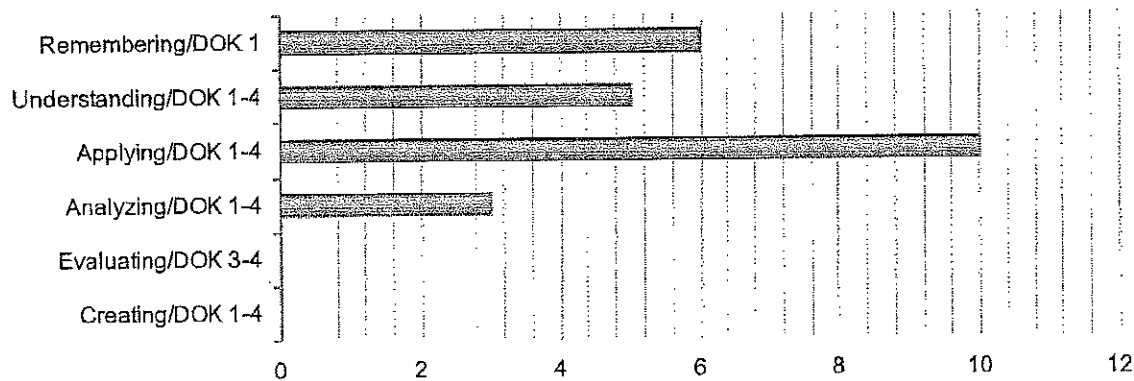
Priority Standards Posted

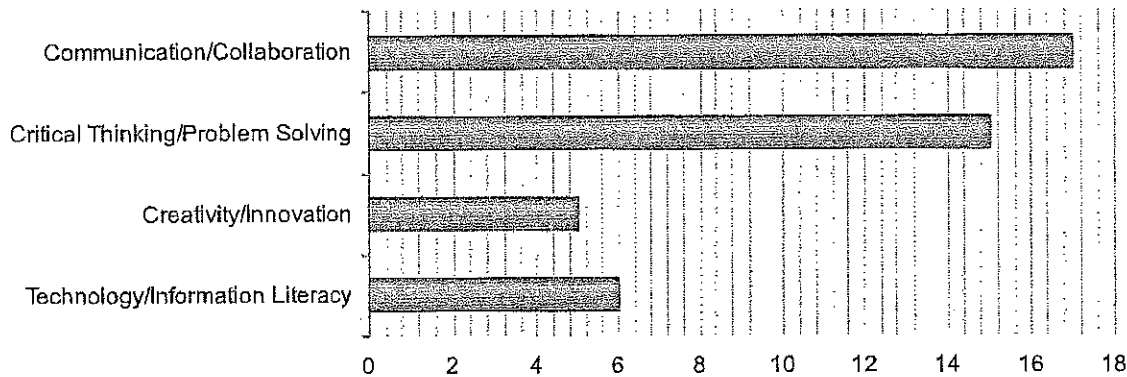

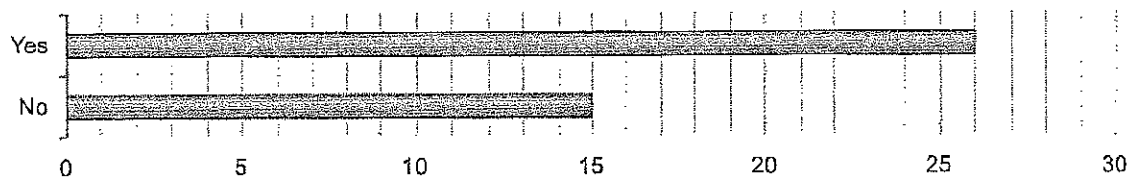

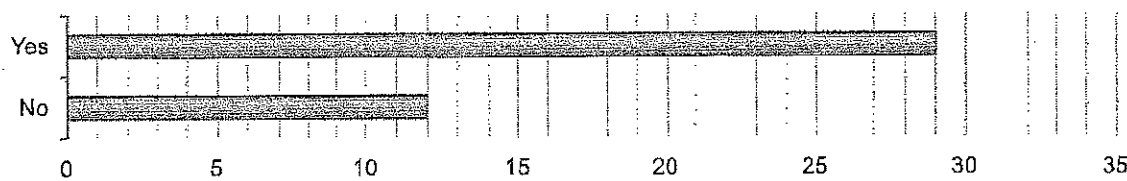
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
