SIP Goals & Progress:

<u>SIP Goal 1</u>: At each grade level 5% more students will achieve their MAP growth target* in the areas of reading and math and close the free/reduced vs. paid lunch status achievement gap in math and reading by 2.5%. *(as compared to trend data indicating what would normally be expected.) Final MAP testing at the end of April will give us our final numbers. Chapter six presentation of Game Changers was postponed due to staff surgery.

<u>SIP Goal 2</u>: At each grade level we will close the free/reduced vs. paid lunch status attainment gap by 2.5 %. Summer reading program planning has taken some steps forward. In addition to potentially having Trinity Lutheran and Lot 12 on board, transportation has authorized use of a van for transportation of students to and from program location. Preliminary 2018 SIP talks have included more focused teacher PD on instructional needs, including visiting colleagues classrooms once each semester throughout the year.

<u>SIP Goal 3</u>: As a result of a focused effort related to "soft skills" (organization, goal setting, acts of kindness, etc.) activity participation, I am an Eagle, Eagle Hours and attendance percentages will increase over 2015-16 percentages. 167/196 students are currently involved in at least one DLR extracurricular activity (85%.) Last year 86% of our students ended the year involved in at least one extracurricular. 113/196 (57.65%) have at least ten hours of community service thus far this year as compared to 38.16% at this time last year. Current attendance rate is 94.65% as opposed to 95.7% at this time last year.

PPAC: - Mr. Albrecht conducted the 2-8-2017 with an agenda that included 1) Home to School Communication, 2) Preliminary handbook change suggestions and 3) Professional School Counselor introduction and presentation.
