• Met with PPAC on Nov. 30th Covered student surveys, Hawk Profile Index. One issue that came up during Q&A was how often we found drugs on campus. I explained our protocol for searches, and that we rarely find students in possession, but that doesn't mean students do not bring drugs to school.

• Mid-term updates due January 10th.

2016-2017 SIP Update

Goal I: Oregon High School staff and students will develop a stronger sense of community during the course of the 2016-2017 school year.

Third student climate survey will be administered January 13th. Results should be back by BOE meeting 1/17 when I do my mid-year update.

• Speaking of survey results, I am anticipating a drop in student satisfaction as a result of changes I made to Power Hour effective January 9th. All kids now eat in cafeteria in two lunch periods: A lunch juniors/seniors. B lunch freshman and sophomores. All kids are assigned a study period opposite their lunch period.

Reasons for change are as follows: 1) We did not see a drop in student Fs for first semester that we anticipated-basically unchanged over first semester for 2015-16. 2) Adjustments we tried to make to get kids who needed to meet with teachers didn't work. We don't have enough adults to create a second level of oversight to get high-risk kids where they needed to be. 3) While we thought this would increase time for teacher collaboration, the opposite was true.

Goal I I: 50% of Oregon High School Students will improve their Hawk Profile (based on Academics, Service, Leadership, and Activities) Index before the end of the school year.

- Roll out will be January 17th to kids. They will initially receive a color paper copy, but will be
 electronic check-ins after that. There will no longer be a "draft" with the change in Power Hour
 to lunch/assigned study periods. Teacher-kid mentorships will be based on those kids assigned
 to study periods. As best as we could, kids were assigned to teachers best tied to their grade
 level and/or interests.
- Kids will see two more Hawk Profile updates for remainder of the year: 1) end of third quarter 2) end of the school year.
