The athletic department recently purchased a new portable outfield fence for use at OHS events at Park West, primarily to use as an outfield fence on the varsity diamond. For years, a mesh "snow fence" had been setup for this purpose but was substandard both functionally and aesthetically. The new fence comes in panels that can be moved and set up fairly easily. Possible other future uses include cross country and soccer.



Spring Sports Update

Baseball – As of April 11, the varsity baseball team is currently 2-5 (1-2 in BNC play). The fr-soph team is 0-6 (0-4 BNC)

Softball – As of April 11, the varsity softball team is currently 5-3 overall, 2-2 in BNC play. The fr-soph team is 6-2 (2-0 BNC).

Boys Track – The OHS boys won the 40th annual Gebhardt-Worley Invitational on April 9, finishing one point ahead of both Dixon and Erie-Prophetstown.

Girls Track – The OHS girls finished in 6th place at the Morrison Relays on April 7 and in 7th place at the Gebhardt-Worley Invitational on April 9.

Junior High Track – DLR Jr. High opened their season at Dixon on April 7 and hosted their first home meet on April 11.
