Winter Sport/Activity updates

Boys Basketball – As of Feb. 13, the Hawks had a record of 4-22 overall, 1-8 in BNC play. Several seniors have been dismissed from the team for disciplinary reasons over the past month. The sophomore team (consisting of mostly freshmen) is 3-22, 1-8. The freshman are 7-5. The IHSA Regional tournament will be held beginning the week of Feb. 20 at Rockford Christian. Oregon will play North Boone in the regional opener.

Girls Basketball – The Lady Hawks varsity team finished the season with a 12-17 record, including a 3-7 mark in BNC play, and a first round loss in the IHSA Class 2A Byron Regional. The sophomores finished 15-12, 5-5 in the BNC. The freshman team finished with a record of 11-6.

Wrestling – The Hawks finished their regular season with a dual meet record of 16-16, finishing in 5^{th} place of 10 teams at the Winnebago 1A IHSA Regional, and qualifying four wrestlers for the IHSA sectional meet. At the Byron 1A Sectional, senior Anthony Marchetti qualified for the state finals by finishing in third place.

Boys Bowling – The Hawks ended their season with a 6-10 dual match record and finished in 9th place of 10 teams at the IHSA regional tournament. Sophomore Austin Strite did advance to the Sectional tournament individually and finished in 40th out of 136 bowlers.

Girls Bowling – The Lady Hawks finished their regular season with an undefeated record of 15-0 in dual matches. The team has now won 40 consecutive dual matches dating back to December of 2014. At the IHSA regional, the Lady Hawks finished in 2^{nd} place overall only 65 pins behind champion Sycamore. The team advanced to the Sectional meet at LaSalle-Peru where they just missed out on advancing to the state finals, finishing in fifth place. Individually, Caitlyn Kaltenbrun did qualify for the state finals.

Academic Bowl – OHS participated in the Big Northern Tournament on Feb. 20 at Mendota.

Junior High Girls Basketball – As of Feb. 9, the 8th grade team had a record of 3-6 while the 7th graders were 2-7.

Junior High Wrestling – There are 29 boys out for Jr. High wrestling this year which is slightly up from last season's 26. The team's record as of Feb 9 was 6-0-1.

Junior High Music – The music departments at DLR and OES competed in the Route 72 Conference Solo and Ensemble Contest held on Feb. 4 at Byron. DLR & OES had a total of 109 performances (solos, duets, trios, quartets, quintets, and choirs). 75 of those were 1st place ratings (10 perfect scores). 33 were second place ratings. One was a third place rating. DLR JH Band's perfect scores were: Abi Miller (alto sax solo), Heather Braden (alto sax solo), Lydia Cermak (French horn solo), Libby Hinshaw & Claire Labash (flute duet), Libby Hinshaw & Claire Labash & AlexaLin Moses (flute trio), and Claudia Reckamp, Lydia Cermak, Abigail Tomlinson (brass trio). The OES 6th grade band's perfect scores were earned by Brandon Rowe (drum set solo) and Alex Hinshaw (trombone solo).

For choir, there were 21 Division 1 ratings and 3 Division 2 ratings. Isabella Olalde and Bella Koertner eraned perfect scores for their vocal solos.
