Computer Programming

Mrs. Pattat has created the following update and course sequence for computer programming in the coming years:

After meeting with faculty, alumni, and students at IMSA, we have designed the following 4-year stream for Computer Science at OHS.

Year 1 – Intro to programming using JAVA

Year 2 – Web design utilizing HTML, CSS, and possibly touching on JavaScript, jquery, XML

Year 3 – Advanced JAVA with Robotics

Year 4 – Programming in C# and/or AP CS
