Drug Testing

As of Oct. 22, 68 students had been randomly tested at OHS. All results were negative. Also, on Thursday, November 1, KSB returned to the Blackhawk Center to do another round of preparticipation drug testing for athletes that did not have this done in August. Athletic Community Service

Football – Football team members performed several services this season. On July 28, they volunteered to work at Etnyre Manufacturing's Family Fair helping serve food in the main food line and from individual tents, did garbage patrol, worked the event ticket and verification tent, and did bouncy house supervision for kids. Also over the summer, members worked eight hours at the football programs' Iron Hawks Golf Event Fundraiser. They also helped paint the OHS Weight Room in the Blackhawk Center. This fall, team members also read to elementary students and met with them at lunchtime. 686 service hours were accumulated, a new high for the football program.

Volleyball - OHS players led the youth summer volleyball camp. They led warm up games, drills, and different games to help youth campers PreK-8th grade learn the game of volleyball. Some players ran and planned activities for their own courts. Also, this year, 22 players and the committee members from Volley for the Cure went to the DeKalb Relay for Life event over the summer. They ordered and wore "Find Joy" shirts in honor of Christa Heitter. They donated \$2,723.50 in memory of Christa. At the event they participated in the Opening Ceremony and walked laps to honor the fight against cancer. These events totaled 427 hours of service.

Fall Sports

Football – The varsity football team finished the season with a 3-6 record. The sophomore squad finished with a 5-4 record, while the freshmen went 4-0.

Volleyball – The varsity volleyball finished with an overall record of 24-12 and 7-3 in BNC games. They advanced to the regional final before falling to Lena-Winslow. The JV squad was 17-9-1 overall while the freshmen finished 17-12-4.

Soccer – For the fourth year in a row, the Hawks advanced to the IHSA 1A Regional title game. They defeated Byron in the semi-final but fell to Stillman Valley 1-0 in the final. The varsity squad finished with a record of 6-14-3 overall.

Cross Country – The girls team finished in 7th place of 8 at the Big Northern Conference meet while the boys finished 9th of 9 teams. For the first time in several seasons, both the OHS girls and boys' teams qualified for the IHSA sectional meet by finishing in the top 7 at the Winnebago 1A Regional. At the Sectional meet hosted here in Oregon at Park West, OHS had no state qualifiers. The girls team finished 11th of 21 teams while the boys finished 20th of 21.

Jr. High Boys Basketball – The DLR Jr. High season started in October. The 7th grade team finished in 6th place of 8 at the recent DLR Jr. High Invitational while the 8th grade was 8th of 8.
