2021-2022 SIP Plan:

Highlights to our SIP:

- 1) Family involvement scores fell throughout last school year, from 70 to 67 points, according to the Measurable Results Assessment (MRA) survey we administered through The Leader in Me. We issued the survey in the fall of 2020 and again in the spring of 2021. Moving forward we will only administer the survey in the spring to measure results. We have developed some action plans to try and address our family connectedness. One highlight is the start of a family monthly newsletter, the first of which may be viewed here:

- 2) Data has suggested for some time that our students do not write well as a whole in this district. We have set some academic writing goals which a new resource, ThinkCerca, should help boost our student's writing abilities. Our ELA classes, 7th and 8th, are currently administering a benchmark writing assessment. We will administer the benchmark assessment again in the winter and spring and will be able to measure student writing growth as a result. Data is not yet uploaded to the SIP, but will be once fall benchmarking is complete. In the full SIP plan (link located below) our Math/Science PLC has uploaded some baseline data related to IXL ELA and Math.
