## School Improvement Plan FY 17:

## SIP Goal 1 - ELA-Literacy \& Math:

- Student Growth: $50 \%$ of all students will achieve or surpass their positive individual student-growth target based on local assessment data.

## Writing Committee:

- A book study will continue in the Fall of 2017 utilizing Writing Strategies. The purpose of the study will assist in teaching writing strategies to help establish grade-level norms.
- A first draft of writing samples with a narrative topic has been created for teachers to use as a resource for expected average norms at each grade-level.

## Summer Reading Program:

- Books will be sent out beginning the week of June $5^{\text {th }}$ to 15 students from $1^{\text {st }}-5^{\text {th }}$ grades.
- A new Facebook page has been added to the program for participating students.


## PE

- Jump Rope for Heart numbers - OES was the third highest school out of twenty schools in the territory for raising money with $\$ 16,049$. We were also the highest in Ogle County.


## English Language Learners

- There are currently 17 students at OES who receive ELL services. Each student is tested with the standardized state testing for that age-level. Scores range from 1 (beginner) to 6 (native-like proficiency). Five of the students scored within the beginner level. The rest of the students scored higher.


## Points of Interest:

- On May $10^{\text {th }}$, representatives from ReMax were at OES and provided a presentation on hot air ballooning. Fourth through sixth grade students learned about some of the history behind hot air balloons and also about the related scientific principles. Students were able to take a walk inside a semi-inflated balloon to see its volume.
- On May 11th, OES once again partnered with Oregon McDonald's for McTeacher Night. The school received a portion of sales from the evening, bringing in roughly $\$ 900$ that will support our quarterly celebrations.
- The $2^{\text {nd }}$ annual volunteer appreciation breakfast was held at OES on May $16^{\text {th }}$. Invites were sent to anyone who had volunteered at the school during the course of the year. A variety of breakfast foods were provided by the staff for the volunteers.
- The final OES staff get-together, or "Spring Fling," was held during the evening of May $16^{\text {th }}$. This was one in a series of events designed to bring staff together on a personal level outside of school.


## Grade level updates:

- PreK - Field trip to Summerfield Zoo in Belvidere. "Graduation" ceremony at OHS on May 18 ${ }^{\text {th }}$.
- Kindergarten - Musical concert on the evening of May $5^{\text {th }}$. Field trip to White Pines on May $16^{\text {th }}$. All area PreK's (Nash, Head Start \& Mt. Morris) visited the kindergarten classrooms.
- $1^{\text {st }}$ - Field trip to Blackberry Farm.
- $2^{\text {nd }}-$ no update
- $3^{\text {rd }}$ - Field trip to Oregon library and historical walk in town.
- $4^{\text {th }}$ - Fourth grade students traveled to Chicago on May $9^{\text {th }}$ to explore the Field Museum. The day allowed many students to experience the museum for the first time. Fourth graders were also able to experience the Rockford Symphony Orchestra on May $12^{\text {th }}$. Mrs. Davis orchestrated this trip as a part of her music class.
- $5^{\text {th }}-5^{\text {th }}$ grade visited Midway Village on May $5^{\text {th }}$ to see the Civil War Days held there annually.
- $6^{\text {th }}$ - The spring band/choir concert was held on May $4^{\text {th }}$. A behavior incentive trip to White Pines Skating Rink took place on May 9th.
