### **Current Enrollment:**

Pre-Kinder - 38 7<sup>th</sup> Grade – 117 8<sup>th</sup> Grade – 113

### School Improvement Plan (SIP) Goals & Progress:

SIP Goal 1: DLR PARCC attainment scores for meeting and exceeding in Math and ELA will double from 2017-18 results. 7th grade winter MAP scores for reading showed a slight increase from the fall in the percentage of students we can predict to meet or exceed on the PARCC exam this spring, from 17.9 % to 19.7%. However, approaching expectations prediction dropped from 38.3% in the fall to 27.7%. 7th grade math meets or exceeds predictions went from 5.6% to 6.5%. Approaching expectation went from 36.4% to 38.0%

8th grade winter MAP scores for reading also showed a slight increase from the fall in the percentage of students we can predict to meet or exceed on the PARCC exam this spring, from 25.7% to 27.1%. Approaching expectations prediction increased from 19.5% in the fall to 27.1%. 8<sup>th</sup> grade math meets or exceeds predictions went from 13% to 18.7%. Approaching expectation dropped from 25.9% to 23.4%

80% of DLR students will stay consistent or improve at least one PARCC attainment level on their 2019 test scores in ELA & Math as compared to their 2018 scores. Although attainment numbers were not what we were hoping to see based on winter MAP scores, growth of our students was evident from fall to winter MAP testing.

80% of DLR students will have a positive outlook on school and themselves as measured by a fall of 2018 and spring of 2019 organically developed survey. Data suggests 26/26 of our staff have attended at least one student extracurricular through the course of the year. Many staff have attended multiple events.
