School Improvement Plan (SIP) Goals & Progress:

<u>SIP Goal 1:</u> DLR PARCC attainment scores for meeting and exceeding in Math and ELA will double from the 2016-17 results. Our recent visits to other middle schools in the area yielded some interesting scheduling concepts, but due to our staffing structure not feasible to implement at David L. Rahn (DLR). This mainly had to do with separate reading/writing blocks at each of the three schools visited. However, we also learned that successes in the classroom were attributed to what was going on within the class as well.

SIP Goal 2: Focus on increasing student leadership roles in school such as leading school assemblies, planning SOAR activities and classroom responsibilities. I was able to visit the Illinois Math & Science Academy (IMSA) on Friday, February 23rd to explore their LEAD program which all sophomores take. This is an intensive evening and Saturday course structure designed and taught by upper classmen to all sophomores. To replicate that program would be unfeasible for DLR. However, I did learn that Marmion Academy has a four year leadership class that utilizes Covey's "The Seven Habits of Highly Effective Teens" as their textbook during their freshman and sophomore years. We do study that book as 8th graders at DLR and will also look to see what if anything comes about with "The Leader in Me" implementation prior to exploring a formal leadership plan further.
