School Improvement Goal 1 SAT score improvement

- Continued work on rigorous instructional methods
 - Final consultant visit March 12; focused on incorporation of rigor rubric in planning daily lessons/units
 - Consultant did walk through visits and left feedback for teachers
 - Site visits for inter-rater reliability and discussion at all three buildings; admin from all buildings gave feedback to each other



School Improvement Goal 1 SAT score improvement

- SAT Practice Test results from Feb 14 practice test
 - 62.9% college ready Reading/Writing*
 - 30.3% college ready Math*
 - Overall improvement from October, 2018 test to Feb test
 - 8.4% growth in Reading/Writing
 - 1.9% growth in Math

School Improvement Goal 2 Freshmen On-Track

- 3rd Quarter = 86% On Track (improvement from 81% last month)
- Specific English and Math interventions occurring during study halls
- Student mentoring through Hawks Take Flight program
- Many parent/teacher conferences to work as a team towards getting students back on track.



School improvement goal 3 Attendance

- 3rd quarter mid-point = 92.46%
- Continued recognition of students with perfect attendance
- Weather and illness continue to have an adverse effect on attendance rate
