Current Enrollment:

7th Grade – 113
8th Grade – 94

SIP Goals & Progress:

SIP Goal 1: At each grade level 5% more students will achieve their MAP growth target*in the areas of reading and math and close the free/reduced vs. paid lunch status achievement gap in math and reading by 2.5%. *(as compared to trend data indicating what would normally be expected) **Nothing new at this time. Growth will be measured with spring MAP scores.**

SIP Goal 2: 100% of DLR students will perform at least 10 hours of community service this year. **Currently 79/207 students have eclipsed the 10 hour mark for this year, 38.16%. 24/69 students meeting are F/R lunch status, 36.7%. Second semester service projects need to be completed and we also have yet to complete our all-school service project. To date, 2,983 service hours have been completed this school year**

SIP Goal 3: DLR will increase student connectedness by achieving 80% student participation in DLR sponsored extracurricular activities and 96% attendance. **2014-2015 statistics indicated 65% of DLR students did at least one extracurricular activity. It was discovered that 75% of paid lunch students had done at least one activity last year but only 54% of free/reduced lunch students. Updated with current known participants, we currently have 88.7% of our 8th graders involved in at least one activity (54.5% of which are F/R) and 75.5% of our 7th graders (of which 36.2% F/R) Additionally, 15 of the 27 students not involved yet at 7th grade are F/R (55%.) – 4 of the 10 8th graders are F/R (40%.) Current student attendance rate is 95.88%**

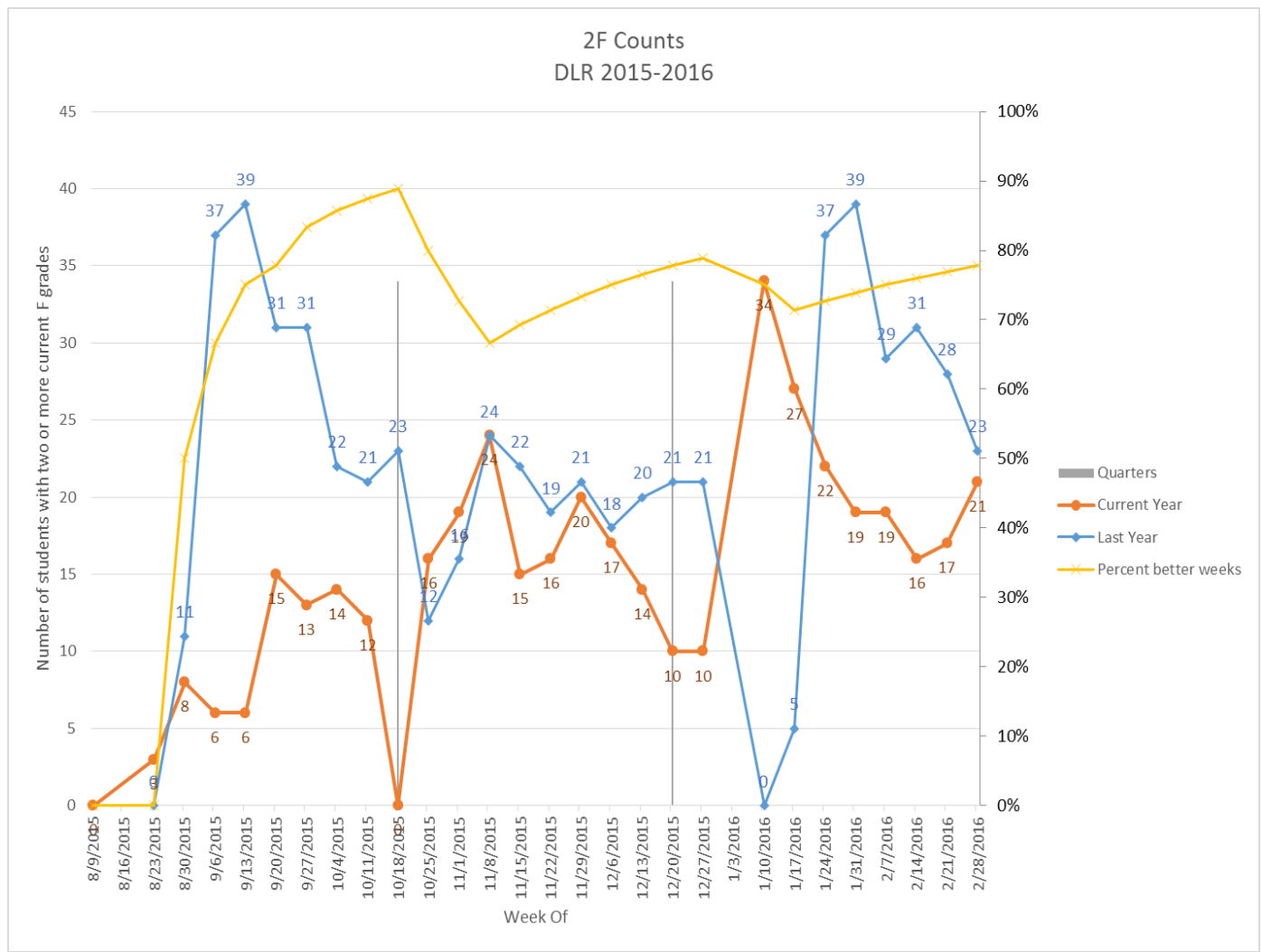
