### **Faculty and Student Recognition/Other Issues**

**Boost Update-Mrs. Starkey** 

We have spent the last month beginning to address the social-emotional/behavior issues of our students. Miss Cremeens will be starting group counseling sessions during study hall one time weekly while Mr. Boyer covers her lunch supervision. We have also met with two professionals (Mandi Zuber and Terry Camplain) to guide the development and implementation of our intervention strategies. The challenge will be finding meaningful, individualized strategies which are not so contrived as to sabotage reintegration into regular school. Both professional stressed that the seeds we plant this year might not produce a strong yield until well after these students graduate.

- field trip to the Freeport Health Network career fair
- continued work on the Boo Bus with students touting their own teamwork and diligence
- field trip to the Social Entrepreneurship class 10-year vision fair
- garage sale project to be held Oct. 12-13<sup>th</sup> at Coliseum
- official procurement of \$500 in grant monies from grants written by students














#### I am comfortable being myself at Oregon High **School**


### There is at least one activity sport/club that interests me at
