# **Student Activities**

- Athletics started August 8. Bright spot = Football had 65 student athletes show up on the first night; hoping to increase number to 75 by the end of the week, once all physicals are turned in

## **New Cell Phone Policy**

- Cell phones will be placed in a cell phone locker when students enter the classroom
- Cell phones will only be removed at teacher discretion/the end of the class period
- This has been communicated to families twice through email and also at the curriculum night. We will also be discussing it at Back to School night and on the first day of school with all students. At the curriculum night, most families were very supportive. In addition, we have had positive feedback when families have come in to register their children. We have had some negative student responses and two emails from parents who do not approve. We also had one parent get a note from a physician requesting their child be allowed to listen to music to help with distractions. We explained that is at teacher discretion.
