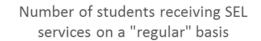

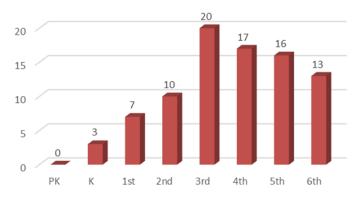

#### **Book Study:**

#### **Special Education:**

- A final training occurred on May 16<sup>th</sup> after school. Teachers provided logistical feedback regarding next year.

• Transition meetings occurred on the teacher institute day with incoming/outgoing teachers for students with a BSAT plan.

#### **Points of Interest:**

- The year-end Book Give Away took place on Monday and Tuesday, May 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>. Students were able to get two books each. A majority of these books were left over from the book exchange that took place in the fall.

Ms. Donnelly and Mrs. Davis led the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> grades in music concerts during the evening. The turnout was fantastic once again.

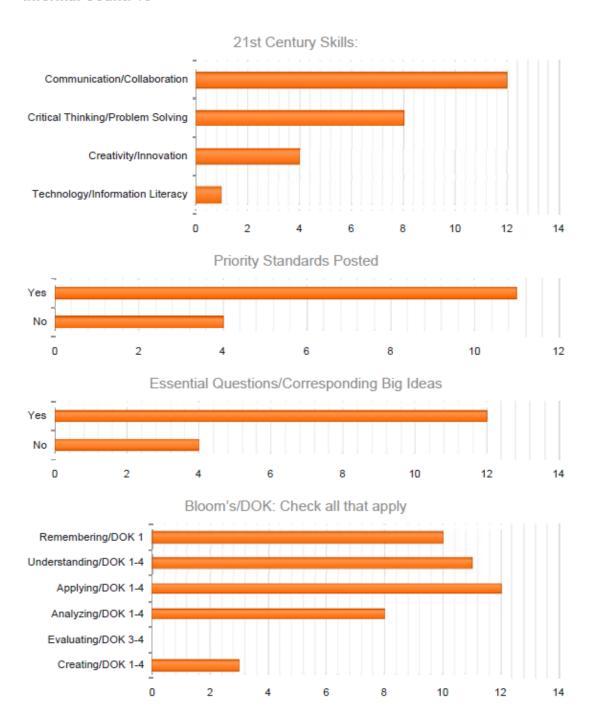

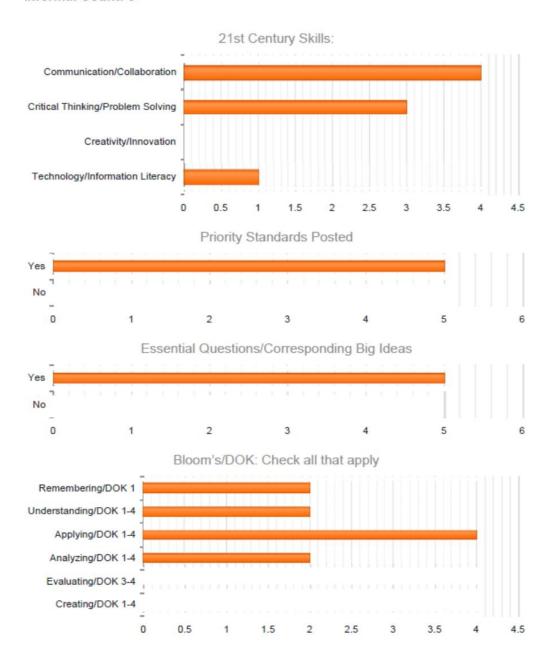
