
Four students slated to attend Creation Entrepreneurial Opportunities program. Approximately 30 students will be attending other programming.

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## Oregon High School 2015-2016 EOY Review

Goal 1: 100% of students at Oregon High School will complete at least 20 community service hours per year

## **Objective**

• 39% of students will complete 20 hours of service (5% higher than in 2014-15).

#### Outcome

41% of students (183/437) earned have 20+ hours.

Goal 2: Increase by five percent per year the number of graduating seniors who have participated in eight extracurricular activities during their high school career.

### **Objective**

51% of the Class of 2016 will have participated in at least eight extracurricular activities.

#### Outcome

- Class of 2016: 39% of class participated in eight or more activities during high school career (Did not meet goal).
- Class of 2017: 74% in an activity
- Class of 2018: 75% in an activity
- Class of 2019: 69% in an activity

# Goal 3: All teachers will use priority standard-aligned assessment data from one RCD unit they have created to do the following:

#### Objective

- 1) Determine how much students learned based on both instruction and assessment results tied to that unit.
- 2) Establish baseline data for that unit. The long-term goal for this data will be measuring proficiency/mastery of priority standards taught in all courses.
- 3) Teachers will provide an informal synopsis of their analysis no later than the end of third quarter.

#### **Outcome**

All teachers turned in their synopsis.

| SIP Goal 4: Decrease the gap in the percent of students who have F's between free/reduced |

### Objective

• Reduce F gap between Free/Reduced and pain lunch students to 3/65%.

#### Outcome

Gap increased over last year by 1%.

# Goal 5: 100% of the students enrolled at Oregon High School will be on track for graduation at the end of each school year.

#### Objective

 100% of all students on track for graduation by end of the school year.

#### Outcome

- 84.4% of the Class of 2019 is on track.
- 87% of the Class of 2018 is on track.
- 99.2% of the Class of 2017 is on track.
- Waiting on 2016 results (two students may earn diploma during summer school)

#### SIP Goal 6:

- At least 30% of the class of 2018 will complete an AP class with a grade of a C- or better by the end of their sophomore year.
- At least 60% of the class of 2017 will complete an AP/Dual Credit class with a grade of a C- or better by the end of their junior year.
- At least 90% of the class of 2016 will complete an AP/Dual Credit class with a grade of a C- or better by the end of their senior year.

#### Objective

- 30% of the class of 2018 will complete an AP class with a grade of a C- or better
- 60% of the class of 2017 will complete an AP/Dual Credit class with a grade of a C- or better
- 90% of the class of 2016 will complete an AP/Dual Credit class with a grade of a C- or better

#### Outcome

- 2016: 70.4% completed course
- 2017: 49.6% completed a course
- 2018: 18.1% completed a course
- 171/176 (97%) placed students earned a C- or higher second semester
