

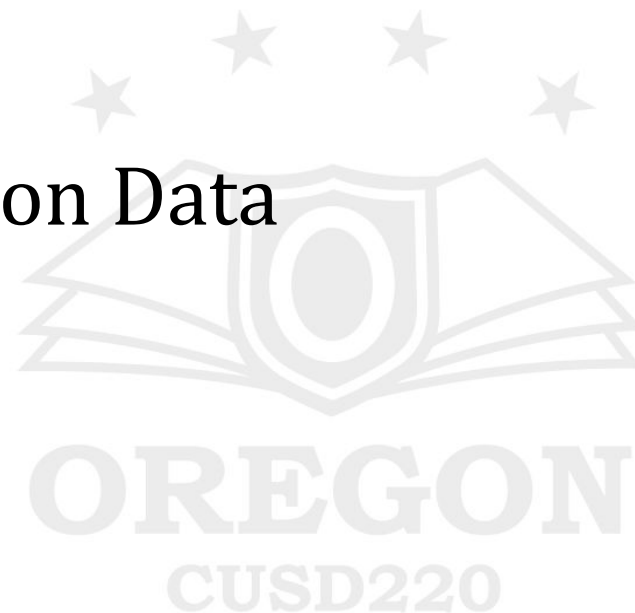

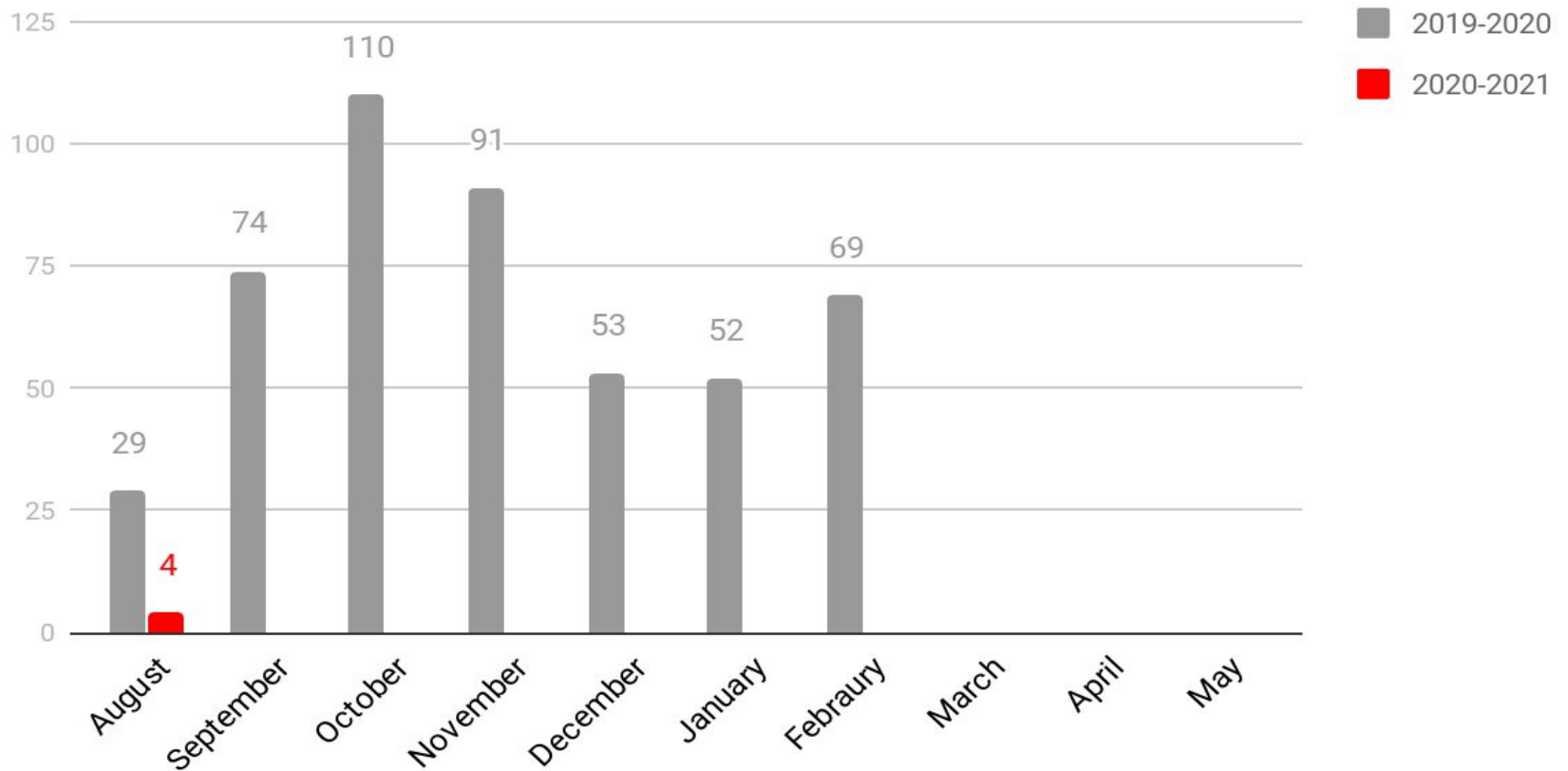

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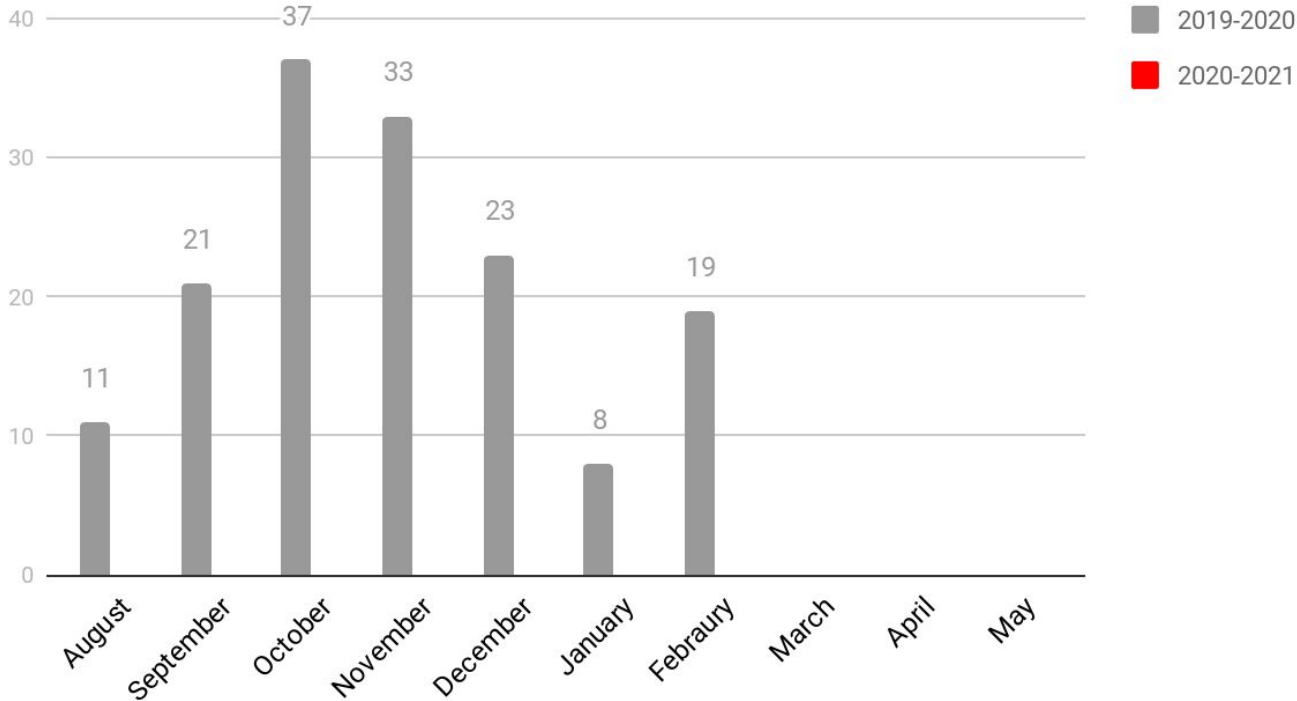
## Detentions





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## Saturday Schools/Extended Detentions



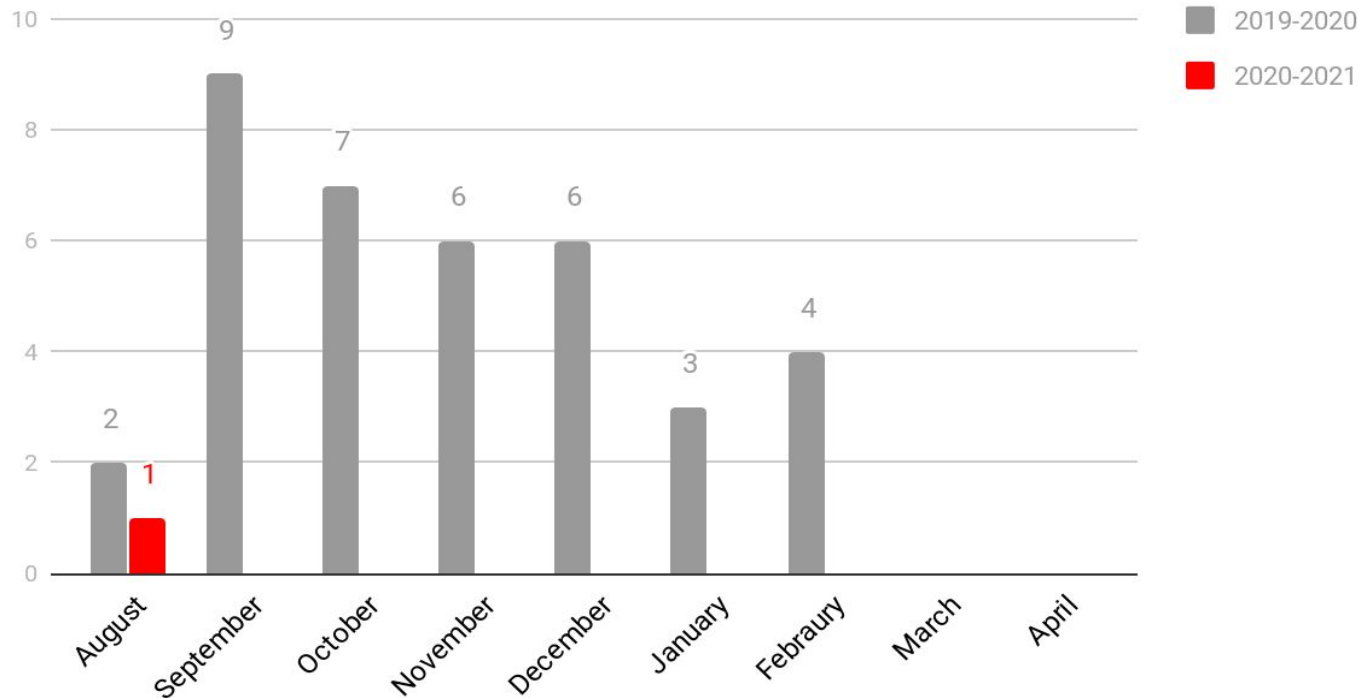

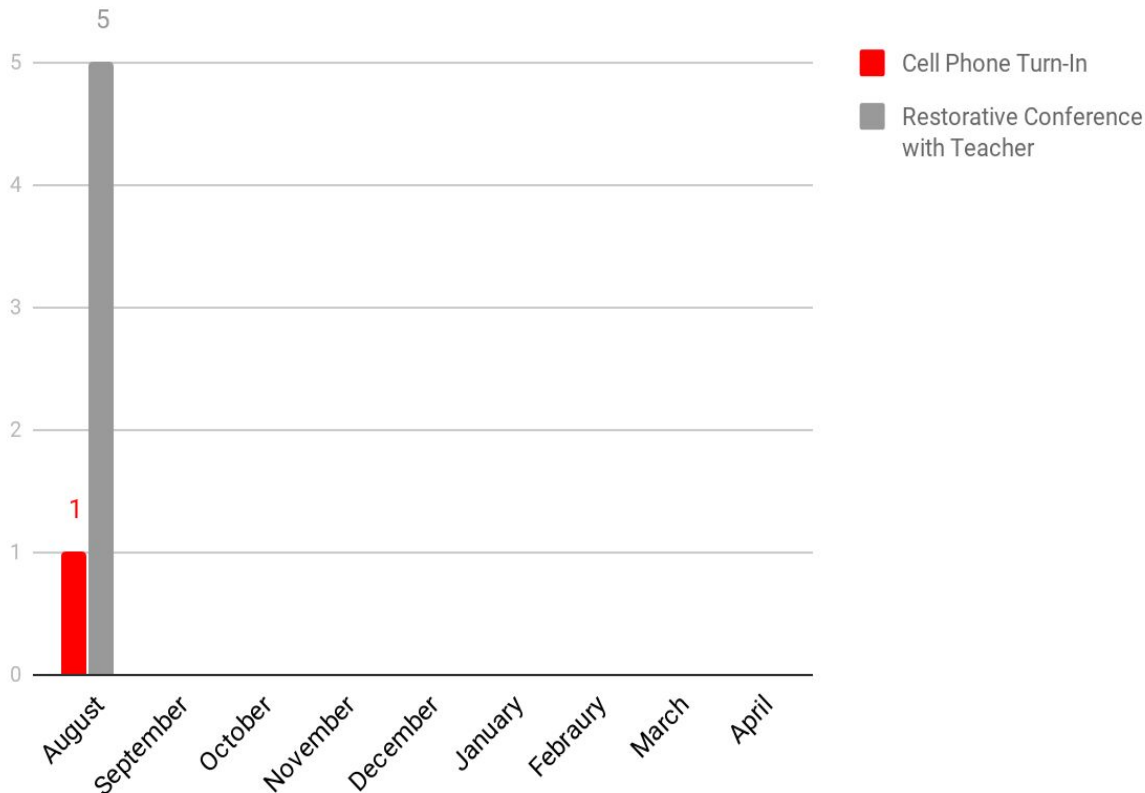

- Restorative conferences were used in place of detentions for tardies to class/class cuts.
