E-Learning Positives

- □ Utilization of Google training (Mobile Minds)
- Many teachers were already using Google classroom, so students were familiar with how to do it
- □ Integration of HMH electronic resources
- Efficiency in work/assessment needed to gain an understanding of student mastery
- Discovery of new online learning tools (i.e. virtual fieldtrips, Zoom for a variety of purposes)



E-Learning Challenges

- Students who did not have internet access; we printed 25 paper packets every week for pickup or delivery
- Engagement and time management
- Wide range in delivery of instruction/expectations for assignments
- □ Grading/feedback
- Wide range of comfort by teachers for teaching online





Impact on Teaching and Learning

- Classes that are linear and build have been most impacted (i.e. all math classes, Spanish, computer sciences); teachers have done their best to teach new material with varying levels of success
- Assessments were all open book/at home which makes it difficult to know student mastery levels
- Teachers have varying degrees of comfort with online teaching. Depending on the teacher, students got a very different experience.
- □ AP tests were all done online





Data from eLearning

- 81% attendance rate (daily check in with their first hour teacher or call to the attendance secretary)
- □ As of 5/12/2020, 81% of our students are passing or passing with distinction (coincidence?)
- □ Data from student survey indicated that (133 responses):
 - □ 51.9% felt the workload was just right
 - □ 66.2% felt that the assignments were as rigorous as "normal" school
 - 88% felt that the hardest part of eLearning was focusing and time management
 - 72.2% had participated in at least one video class/meeting with their teacher



Data regarding incompletes

- **Incompletes = a student did nothing in the class over the eLearning period
- As of 5/12/2020, there are 78 students with at least one incomplete
- □ Of the 78 students, 46 of them have multiple incompletes
- Students with incompletes will have time and support over the summer to complete their classes; we will also schedule them into an intervention period in the fall
