Oregon Elementary School

- Mrs. Stewart held 21 individual Zoom meetings with students, during many of these meetings she also checked in with parents to provide support as well. Mrs. Stewart also attended 47 classroom Zoom meetings, during several grade levels she facilitated a social skills lesson on topics such as emotional regulation, perseverance, and calming strategies. Mrs. Stewart also hosted 4 Student Ambassador meetings via Zoom. She has also reached out to 20 parents individually for support and address family needs. Mrs. Stewart has attended weekly staff meetings, student services meetings, webinars for professional development, and student meetings. Mrs. Stewart also helped to coordinate and facilitate the all-district parent support Zoom meeting.
- Mr. Montanola contacted 54 families via 252 phone calls between the hours of 9 am to 6 pm. He provided emotional support to parents and caregivers and encouraged students to do as much of schoolwork as possible and treated successfully two enuresis cases. In addition, he provided resources to families who are facing food insecurity, and loss of income, and consultation for parents to address their concerns about their children falling behind in school due to school closures. He also participated in a parent support group and attended many zoom meetings with teachers and students. Mr. Montanola also attended the following webinars for professional development:
