Faculty and Student Recognition/Other Issues

- Mr. Sitze presented at *Celebrating Language Arts*, Wheaton North's Institute Day conference on March 3rd.

Data Team Update

Recommendation from Kara Vandas after her 2-27-17 visit: The high school is at a critical point. They are struggling with the Data Teams process, as the time is not available for them to collaborate regularly (weekly or every other week). The focus of our meetings was to review how the first cycles went this year, during the time when Power Hour was available. The one team (SAT) that has weekly time to meet is meeting and has made some good progress. Other teams have not been able to meet regularly.

Mission: Educate students to be lifelong learners who are productive, responsible citizens.



Next Steps / Recommendations:

- Determine non-negotiables for RCD and Data Teams that will ensure the purpose of the work and the outcomes are achieved. Use those non-negotiables to ensure high school teachers have time to meet and collaborate. (align negotiables to research behind Data Teams)
 - To make Data Teams functional, either the schedule needs to be totally overhauled or collaboration can be done through a different structure but with the same intent. Possibly keeping the goal of determining student learning needs and necessary changes to instruction but changing to a structure that is also proven like Instructional Coaching.

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Practice SAT Results from 2-16-17

74 juniors took the practice SAT test on February 16th. The results for both English math are in the attached Power Point. The results are better than we expected, particularly for college-bound math and overall English. The state-wide SAT will be April 6th. We are also going to compare these results in percent meeting benchmarks with the last state-wide ACT test that was given in March 2015.
