



Detention Count






In-school Suspension Count

Behavior Data Overview that has Prompted Change

Behavior	2016-2017 Referral Count	2017-2018 Referral Count	Overall Change from 2016-2017
Tardy to School/Class	1,788	2,196	22.8% increase
Truancy	103	265	157.3% increase
Electronic Device	54	35	35.2% decrease

2018-2019 Handbook Changes:

- More structured tardy policy, addition of 4-minute warning bell
- Truancy parent-student conferences required, Saturday School to make time back
- Creation of school-wide cell policy



Consequences Data Overview that has Prompted Change

Behavior/Consequenc e	2016-2017		Overall Change from 2016-2017
Detention Assigned	1,356	1,280	5.6% decrease
ISS Assigned	351	359	2.3% increase
OSS Assigned	39	44	12.8% increase

2018-2019 Handbook Changes:

- Removal of ISS, Addition of 2 and 4 Hour Saturday School
- Creation of Intervention Center, addition of re-entry check-in meetings
- Continued use of Alternative to Suspension Program for out-ofschool suspension consequences





Additional Changes for 2018-2019:

- Handbook changes shared-out in student-lead video at the start of school
- Handbooks printed for all students, which includes updated policies, a student planner, and a passbook
- Incorporating restorative/reflective worksheets for detentions and Saturday school assignments
- Use of Intervention Center for extended-absence students (such as long-term OSS)
- Exploration of pro-active approaches to behavior and attendance in accordance with SIP action steps
