## **Drug testing**

#### **Athletic Community Service Update**

Bowling – The boys and girls bowlers held a bowl-a-thon the night of Feb 24/25 to raise money for the Burke family for medical expenses for Tate Burke. Tate has been in the middle school bowling program. The event went from 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. raised almost \$2,000. The Oregon bowlers combined for 122 hours of service with this event.

Cheerleading – The OHS cheer team earned service hours through several different events. After football games this past fall, they helped clean up the bleachers. Several members of the squad volunteered their time to assist and teach the Jr. Tackle Cheerleaders. Other projects were working at the Oregon Masonic Lodge Car Show, delivering Christmas presents to Pinecrest, and selling breast cancer awareness T-shirts to benefit Heitter family and Winnebago Pink Heels. These projects combined for over 260 hours of service.

Girls Basketball – The OHS girls' basketball squad also held several service events. The project that earned the most hours was holiday gift wrapping for the 6<sup>th</sup> year in a row for an organization called Earth Angels. In January, many members of the program went to Byron to help with the Special

Olympics Skills Challenge Day. And near the start of the season, the team held a sports equipment donation event. These three events added up to 142 hours of service time.
