Lighthouse Team coordinator, Adam Albrecht, Bonnie Rasmussen and Nate Rogers led staff on November 4th through a demonstration of Kami. Kami is a software program that allows PDFs to be manipulated both digitally and audibly. Kami allows users to not only alter and write text on the PDF, but also highlight text that is read to the user (text to speech) which is extremely helpful to our lower readers. Leader in Me makes available "Lead Journals" in a PDF format that allow students to interact with each habit in a meaningful way during lesson discussions. Kami would allow for even more meaningful digital interaction with student journals. Obviously, teachers will also utilize this during classroom instruction.

I would first like to acknowledge the flexibility of our staff for what has been a trying week and a half to date and will be two weeks overall at the end. Two teachers have been on quarantine since November 2, one teacher November 9 & 10, an aide November 9 – 14, and myself since November 2.
