

Academic Improvement

- School Improvement Plan Goals 2024-25
 - Performance
 - ELA- By the end of the 2024-25 school year, 53% of OES students will Meet or Exceed on the Illinois Assessment of Readiness in ELA.
 - Math-By the end of the 2024-25 school year, 51% of OES 3rd-6th Graders will Meet/Exceed on the Illinois Assessment of Readiness
 - We will continue to focus on improving academic outcomes in both ELA and Math. Both percentages for the goal would represent a 5% increase from the 23-24 School Year.
 - If attained, both academic goals would be well above the state average and would put us in position to be the top performing elementary school in the area.
 - The addition of a 3rd administrator to OES will allow me to spend more time providing direct support to instructional practices in the building.
 - Systems
 - Behavior- By the end of the 2024-25 school year, Oregon Elementary School (OES) will increase the amount of time students remain in the classroom by reducing the need for Time in Office, In-School Suspensions, and Out-of-School Suspensions by 10%.
 - Mrs. Webb and Mr. Cozzi have spent a large portion of their time this summer working to provide more structured support to our discipline system.
 - One key component of that work is the creation of a Behavior Matrix which clearly defines types of behavior and a possible response to those. This will be used by both teachers and administrators to more effectively support student behavior.

 - Mrs. Webb will be dedicated to supporting PreK-2nd Grade behavior, while Mr. Cozzi will be the first line of support to 3rd-6th. They will support each other across the grade level bands, but we believe clearly defining this will best support our staff.

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- Culture
 - This was a challenge for us to come up with a goal as there is not currently an existing tool we have that measures culture in our district. We created a short survey to staff that will be given multiple times this year to provide baseline data before working with Dr. Caposey to potentially select a tool to use with students, staff, and the community.
 - Goal: By the end of the 2024-25 School Year, 90% or more of staff will report our school has high academic standards and demands high quality work from all students.
 - Currently 80% of our staff agree with this statement on a survey conducted at the beginning of the month.
 - This was the lowest performing question ranging from staff experience at school/administrative support, etc.
 - I believe there are pockets that demand very high quality work, but there are also areas of the building where this needs to improve.
